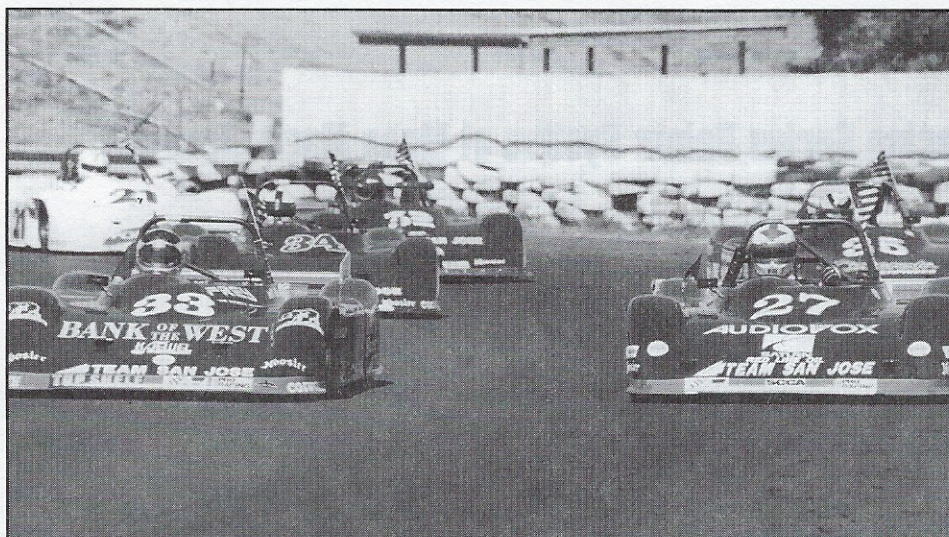


ROOT, ROOT, ROOT for the Home Team

In 1988, City-Team auto racing burst onto the West Coast sports scene. Fans and media immediately identified with their city's team as it competed with other cities in a new racing series called the American City Racing League.

The ACRL is sanctioned by the Pro Racing Division of The Sports Car Club of America and managed by a Board of Directors. Currently 10 cities are represented in the ACRL.

To qualify each team must designate three points scoring cars. The top two finishing cars from each team score team points and all score driver points and participate in the purse.

There are currently 10 West Coast Cities represented in the ACRL, allowing spectators to cheer on their favorite city's team.

The ACRL has two divisions - Super Sports 2000 with Ford Cosworth 2-liter, 16 valve DOHC power, and Sports 2000 using the Ford 2-liter single cam engine. The cars run on Hoosier spec tires and use Daeco racing fuel.

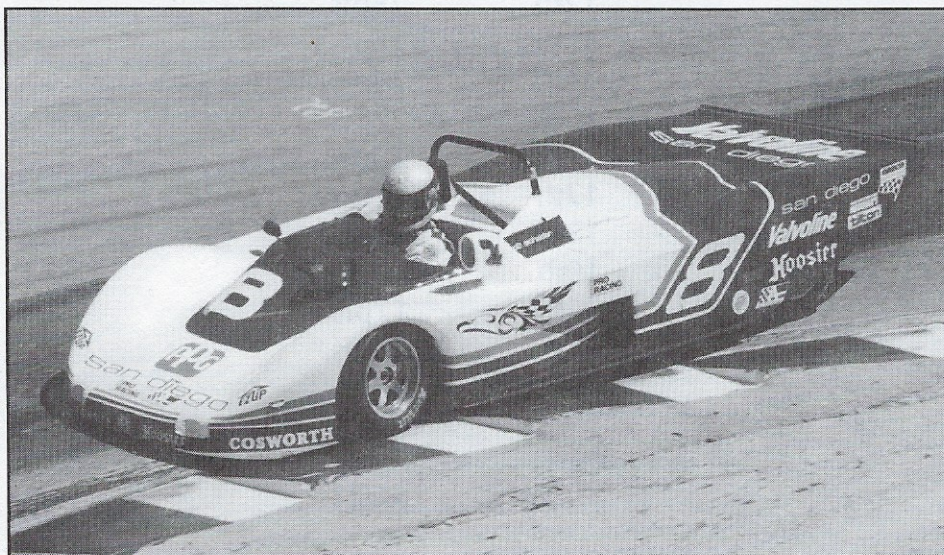
This is ACRL's second race of their 8 race season and the first of two appearances at Mesa Marin. San Jose, 1995 Champs, leads San Diego, 1994 Champs, by just 14 points. Team Santa Barbara and Team Las Vegas will be close challengers.

Hot Shoe, Bob Schader, Team San Diego, leads the points after winning Laguna Seca. He's now on a five race winning streak. The 1992 & 1993 Driver Champ, Lee Lucas, Team San Jose, is second followed by the 1995 ACRL Rookie of the Year, Jeff Glenn

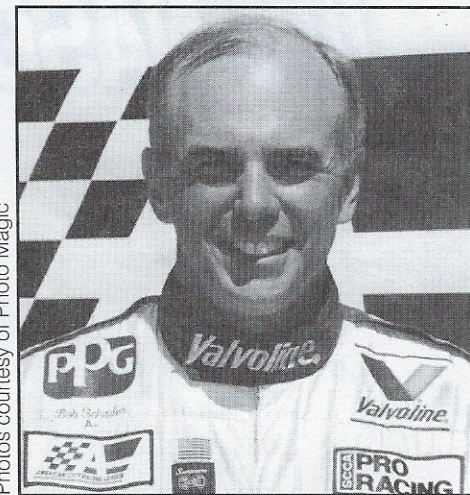
Mesa Marin is the first oval the ACRL has competed on since 1989. Watch for oval track specialist and 1995 USAC Ford Rookie of the Year, Memo Gibley, Team Santa Barbara, to challenge the field of veteran drivers. Margie Smith-Haas, Team San Diego, and Peter Zarcades, Team Las Vegas, are often the pole sitters and favorites to win.

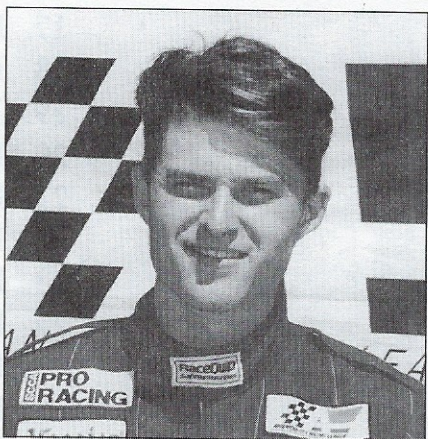
